The migrant workers who are also labor class who depend on their daily wages were left stranded in their workshops indefinitely depending on the NGO's food grains provision and dal kichadi packets. During this pandemic, Jeevan Dhara understood the plight of the 4 slum communities of Mumbai, the plight of the migrant workers all over Mumbai and recently the plight of the villagers in the Rural part of Umapur, Beed, Maharashtra and reached out to all those in need.

In the beginning we would travel everyday distributing food rations, dal kichadi packets, medicines, sanitary pads, cooking food to dressing diabetic wounds. We did not think of the Covid-19 virus when doing all of the above activities. The joy of serving those in need made us fearless. It did not mean a thing compared to what the media would feed us with every single day.

Even Jeevan Dhara's rehabilitation center for street/slum based drug/alcohol addicts. When all the other rehabilitation centers were temporarily closed, ours ran smoothly.

I would like to end by saying a big thank you to all my individual donors, NGOs, schools, institutions and Corporates whose encouragement we were able to reach out to the masses. May God bless all of you.

I have been associated with Jeevan Dhara, a charitable trust since its inception.

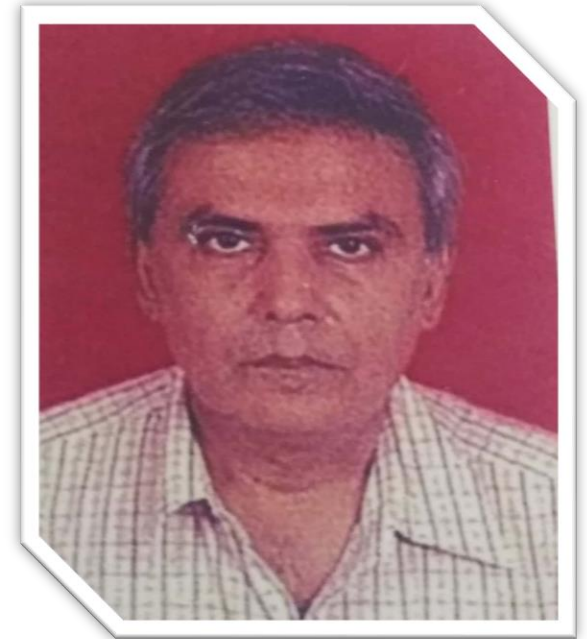
Having understood its objectives and the dedication of the founder of the trust, the offer to participate as a trustee was accepted by me.

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Gene D'Silva, envisions a 'better tomorrow for the underprivileged.'

In 1998, Gene started with an outreach program in Asia's largest slum community - Cheeta Camp. The initial focus, for the first 2 years was to get HIV+ patients accepted in the community, and identifying the needy via door-to-door outreach. Gene distributed food rations to 350 widows, school fees for children between the ages of 3 to 6 years of HIV+ widows and provided medical assistance to HIV+ patients. In the 3rd year, Balwadis and Study Classes were started to help children in the community cope better with their studies and improve their academic performance.

In 2005, Gene along with his wife Shobha Bajpai set up 'Jeevan Dhara' - meaning 'Lifeline', with the vision to provide a 'Lifeline' in the community for a better tomorrow.

For the past 24 years, we have undertaken several initiatives to alleviate the pain and suffering of the poor - from the beginning, with Balwadis in 1998, to a De-Addiction Center in 2008, and various programs customized to help empower the underprivileged in society.

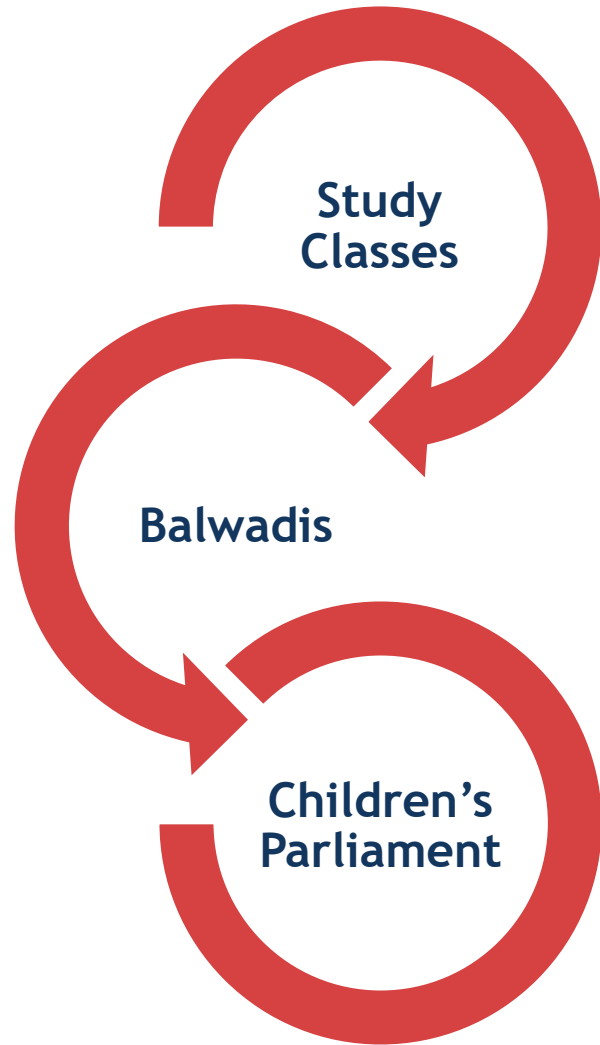

JEEVAN PRASHIKSHAN - Vocational Training

- Jeevan Prashikshan, an initiative to create 'employment' was started in 2007 for those who could not pursue higher studies due to lack of funds, social stigma, etc.
- In addition to the above, it has also helped our own reformed addicts find employment.
- The focus is also to empower women & youth in the community with financial independence.

JEEVAN DISHA - De-Addiction & Rehabilitation

- Looking at the rampant substance abuse in the slums of Cheeta Camp and moved by the helplessness of the addicts' family, Jeevan Disha was an initiative undertaken in 2008.
- Witnessing, firsthand the work, impact & the high recovery rate of addicts, Don Bosco blessed us with their premises in Lonavla to set up a De-Addiction Center.
- We also conduct sessions & workshops to create awareness in the general public





De-Addiction Center, Lonavla

- Due to COVID-19, this year we admitted less patients in our rehabilitation center.
- From April 2020 to March 2021, a total of 14 addicts were admitted in our rehabilitation center.
- Out of these, 5 successfully completed the 3-month course.
- 2 addicts could not continue and hence left the center.
- Presently, there are 8 patients in the rehabilitation center.



Umapur, Beed, Maharashtra



NEW PROJECT

Umapur, in Beed (Maharsashtra) is not developed and the only source of income is the sugarcane factory about 5-6kms away; wherein the parents work while leaving their kids at home and they sometimes go without food.

- ❑ In Feb 2021, we started our rural intervention to implement our programs in the Umapur village.
- ❑ We have about 94 children in our study classes and we are in the process of identifying and implementing different programs.
- ❑ We aspire to provide education, career counseling and skill development. The larger goal is to reduce drop-outs from school and empower the 'girl-child'. On 1st Mar 2021, we started study classes along with welfare activities i.e. distribution of stationery, clothes and soaps.
- ❑ As part of our Welfare Program, we have been able to distribute ration to 290 families to help them in these tough times of the pandemic.

I started having more drugs, because of that I have been restricted from college trice I got my self into many problems because of it, my parents used to shout at me, beat me, at one point they stopped talking to me, as I got my self into more and more drugs, at one point my life was ruined by drugs, at that time one of my relatives told me at this an very nice and decent NGO Jeevan Dhara, I found out it was an nice place, I got my self admitted in Jeevan Dhara at that time I was not about how it's function, when I got admitted there I got a nice counselor and center in-charge Mohd Tofik Shaikh, he was the person in charge of the center and he was also an addict he used to give us counselling and used to share about his addition he was the guy I saw that if he can give up drugs so why not 'I.'

I was there for three months in these period I have learn many things about life which I have not been enjoyed when I was taking drugs, for the first time in 8th year I have celebrate many festival with out drugs as we used to dance and enjoy each and every festival like Holi and Diwali and that to with out drugs, first it was very difficult for me to live with out drugs but by the help of our center in charge and with the help of his counseling I started to live a normal life. I enjoyed that period but some time the thought would come to my mind to give up and run away but, keeping my parents faith in my mind I changed my mind and try to stay positive by the help of counselling. when I came home from center it help me in many ways the life I have lived there and by there program I have realized how much beautiful life is and I started my new life by that grace of God which has given me, now I have Fully received from the hell.

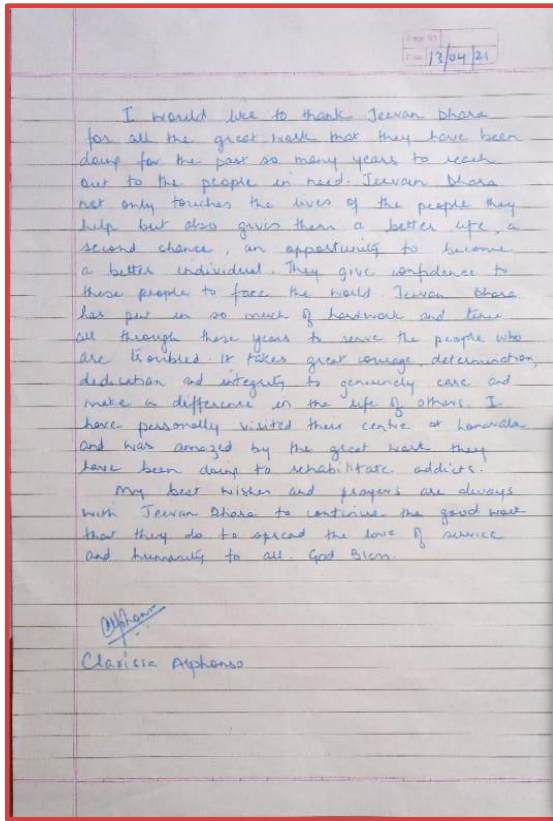

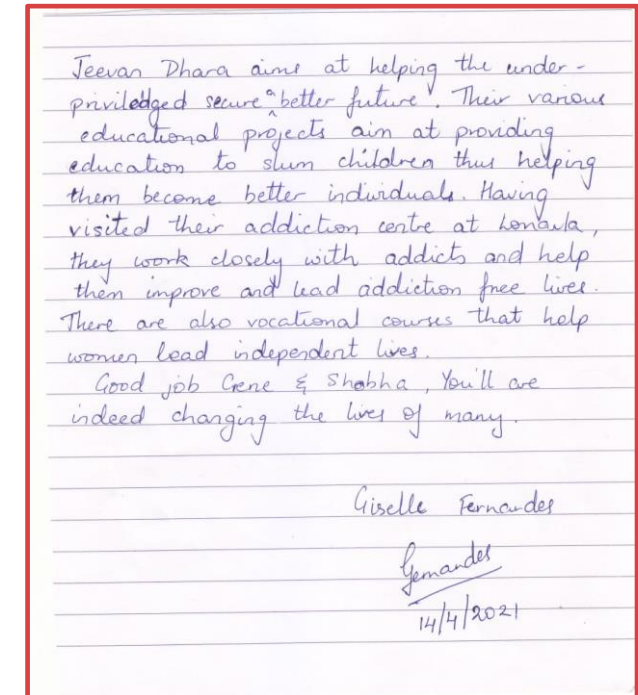
